

Nr. 1: **Maximize** the Book in full screen!

Pop-ups, Tooltips & FREE web links

Dear reader,

You've got here from **HELP yourself**, last of three sections on 1st page where I recommended to **Read this first**. Over there I defined just the reason I wrote this **HELP yourself** section:


“This book with the mouse gives you reader a ride through the entire Web.

In order to make it as enjoyable as possible I give something to **HELP yourself**!”

Now, I'll give you as many details about this 1st topic, **About Pop-ups, Tooltips & Free web links**, to have an “as enjoyable as possible ride through the entire Web”!

When you search the Web with your browser (Google Chrome, Firefox, Microsoft Edge etc.) you are all the time under your browser control, under your browser operating system; you can open a new link when you want it, you can close it and open another link, you can do everything you want because **you know** your browser operating system!

The Book you are now reading opens links through the entire Web, some of them **inside** the Book Tab some other in **new** Tab (next to the Book Tab) and also its **own** links as this one was, **About Pop-ups, Tooltips & Free web links!** After you did **click** on **About Pop-ups, Tooltips & Free web links** link you are now in **new** Tab labeled **Popups-Tooltips-and-weblinks.pdf**, next to **Book** Tab.



You can read the content of this file two ways:

- With **click** on a link from this file (most likely you'll do it this way) which will take you somewhere on the web,
- With **NO** click on **any** link from this file.


If **a)** then the link will take you somewhere in the Web.

You want to return, in this case and in any other case of using a link, **in** the Book Tab to continue reading, no matter where the Book takes you! No matter where a link takes you, you are still under your browser operating system and under the rules used by those who created the book, rules that I have described in this topic! I just wrote the book and told those who created it how to ... create it!


Let's move on with this **HELP yourself** topic!

Two graphical user interfaces (GUI) are used in the Book, **Pop-ups & Tooltips**. Before they will be define by the links to Wikipedia that will help you understand what they are, I have to show you how to get back to the Book Tab after you click on the 1st link of this **.pdf** file, with some screenshots!


Let's click on the 1st link, **graphical user interface** (GUI) of this **.pdf** file and you'll get here:



This is a **new Tab to Graphical user interface – Wikipedia overriding the Popups-Tooltip-and-weblinks.pdf Tab** where you can read what Wikipedia *knows* about ... Graphical user interface, so you'll learn it! How you **get back** to continue reading the **.pdf** file that linked you here at the Wikipedia? That is very important to **know** and to **do it right!** Click the **←** (go back) arrow of **this** Tab (the leftmost symbol under the Tabs row), **NOT** the **x** of the Tab




and you'll be back here:




and continue reading the .pdf file!

If b) then at the END of reading you can return to Pag. 1 of the Book with click on **x** of this Tab:



and you'll get back where you started, at Pag. 1 of the Book, here:



This case:

* a link to a **.pdf** file (with links) to be open entirely in a **new Tab**, is a **unique** case and I had to use it right here, on Pag. 1!

For all the other links:

* two **graphical user interface** (GUI), **Pop-ups** & **Tooltips** are used,

and

* **FREE web links**.

Graphical user interfaces (GUI), **Pop-ups** and **Tooltips** are web browser windows that display only **that part** of a **link** it's my desire you to read first. The rest part of the link is up to you how you want to handle it!

Pop-ups and Tooltips opens in the **Book Tab** while **FREE** web links opens in a **new Tab** as they are there in the web and are the subject of this **HELP yourself Pop-ups, Tooltips & FREE** web links topic.

They are **common** link cases for the whole Book!

How do you **RECOGNIZE** in the text of the *book*, which is **Pop-up**, which is **Tooltip** and which is **FREE** web link?

Pop-ups, **FREE** web links & **Tooltips** are written in **light blue**. To see if a word OR a group of words is the **name** of a **Pop-up**, a **FREE** web link OR the name of a **Tooltip** just **set** your mouse over the **light blue** text and you will see:

a) underlined **light blue** name of the link & link symbol (**index finger**):




for **Pop-ups** and **FREE** web links.

You need to **click** on them to open on the **Book Tab** (**Pop-ups**) OR in a **new Tab**, next to the **Book Tab** (**FREE** web links)!

b) **NOT** underlined **light blue** name of the link & **the mouse cursor** tooltip sign, and the tooltip text is **automatically** displayed, (as it is here on Pag. 3 for the word **widespread**); you don't have to click on it:

I used this example because it shows **two** situations:

a) how to use the **scroll bar** (scroll down the bar, on the right side of the picture) until you can see **all**:



b) how to close the Pop-up and return to reading the Book.


click **surrounded**  (upper right corner of the Pop-up, **NOT** of the Book **Tab**)!

1b) The **human nature** Pop-up [on Pag. 8]. You can see it's a Pop-up when you **hover** the mouse **over** the **light blue** text and see the **index finger** & after **clicking** on it, the **Human Nature** Pop-up opens **in** the Book **Tab**, overriding the text:




Closing and returning to reading the book, simple: **click surrounded**  (upper right corner of the **Human Nature** Pop-up, **NOT** of the Book **Tab**)!

2) The **COVID-19** Pop-up [on Pag. 2]. You can see that it's a Pop-up because it opens **in** the Book **Tab**, overriding the text, as the previous did:




This Pop-up has at the bottom the option [Read more]. Only if you want to see the rest of the link where you can read more, just click [Read more] button! In this case you will see the full link opened in a **new Tab**, next to the Book Tab:




In this case, **closing** and **returning** to reading the book is done in **two** steps because you are NOT in the Book Tab, you are in **another** Tab, next to it after you **click** [Read more] button:

* click X (upper right corner of the COVID-19 – Wikipedia Tab, **NOT** the Book Tab)!

It brings you back here on the Book Tab:



Closing and returning to reading the book, simple: **click surrounded**  (upper right corner of the **Coronavirus disease 2019** Pop-up; a little bit more complicated, but... *it pays*):



Keep reading!

Note1:


Pop-ups that launches into a **new** Tab, next to the Book Tab, closes in **two** steps:

* **close new** Tab

** **close the Pop-up**.


Note2: the same way you **close** Pop-Ups with [**OR Play in new Tab**] button instead of [**Read more**] button.

3) The [Holy Trinity Cathedral in Sibiu, Romania](#) link on Pag. 6 opens in a **new** Tab, “The Holy Trinity Orthodox Cathedral, Sibiu” Tab, **next** to the Book Tab! Surpriseeee; the link didn’t open like the other Pop-Ups you’ve opened so far, but ... in a **new** Tab as FREE web link does:



At the two edges (left and right), there are ◀ and ▶; **clicking** on them you can see many other photos (to the left OR to the right)!

To return to reading the book, to the Book Tab, anytime you want, just **click X** of the “The Holy Trinity Ortodox Cathedral, Sibiu” **Tab** and you are back here on Pag. 6:



Be careful: if you **click X** of the **Book Tab** then you’ll **close** ... the book and you will have to start over, so better **Bookmark** the Book Tab!

My wife Angela did it 10 times in her first 5 days of reading the book!

Now I’d like to introduce you to the need of this ride through the entire Web!

How could I better *introduce* you to the fight between Donald J. Trump and George Soros, these two titans of the century which *I talked about* in this Book, better than this following link does?! The following link will take

you to a **new** Tab and you can get back here, you know how, with **click** on the ← (go back) arrow of **this** Tab (the leftmost symbol under the Tab row), **NOT** on **x** of the Tab!

Centuries fight, fight that is at the score of 1 – 1!

I hope you could see the need for this Pop-ups, Tooltips & FREE web links **HELP yourself** topic!

There will be a few other similar situations!?

Now you have enough help to solve any other **close** Pop-ups, FREE web links & Tooltips difficulties!

Nothing is FREE, FREE, FREE without... risks; it is a Book offering a ride through the entire Web!
